In 2017, Pax Christi Little Rock (PCLR) worked with school counselor Mildred Calhoun to develop a peace curriculum for Rockefeller Elementary. The curriculum was taught and more importantly experienced by the students each day during Arkansas Peace Week.

Peace Week Rally

- Plan a school wide rally
